A Note from Pima County Health Department and the **First Smiles Matter Program**

Tooth decay is the most chronic condition found in childhood, and with proper care, it is preventable. Oral bacteria can be transferred from person to person when sharing cups, spoons, straws, and food. Brushing for two minutes twice a day with a soft-bristled brush and fluoride toothpaste and cleaning between the teeth once a day can help fight cavities and prevent gum issues.

Pregnancy can be an opportunity for expectant mothers to improve oral health and begin to focus on their baby's oral health. Hormone increases during pregnancy may increase the risk of oral diseases like gingivitis (gum disease) or tooth decay. Increased chances for tooth decay might occur with changes during pregnancy. Some changes might be the mother's diet as she needs to eat more often, and some women notice they have less saliva or more acids in the mouth from morning sickness.

The Pima County Health Department's First Smiles Matter Oral Health Program, funded by First

Things First, provides free oral health screenings to expectant mothers and children ages birth to five. During the dental screening, participants learn about oral health, information to address any concerns, and assistance with finding dental care. First Things First and the First Smiles Matter program helps to build healthy oral habits for a lifetime. Please call to schedule a visit or, for more information, 520-724-7902






